

Tactical Emergency Medical Training

September 21-26, 2009



Providing out-of-hospital care in the austere environment of a tactical law enforcement mission requires special judgment and skills not taught in standard Medical School and Paramedic Courses. **The Tactical Medicine Course** is an intense scenario based classroom and hands on field training program designed in collaboration with the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the University Of Toledo College Of Medicine and the Saint Vincent's Mercy Medical Center Emergency Medicine Residency Program and is designed to present the Advanced Life Support Provider with valuable medical skills and the tactical training required to use them in extreme environments.

This program is conducted by practicing physicians, tactical paramedics, SWAT members, law enforcement trainers, medical educators, and credentialed experts in tactical medicine.

This 54 hour course provides an intense educational experience that includes an advanced skills lab and exceptional hands on learning opportunities, in a physically demanding tactical environment.
